Smolinski indicated that he was going to look at a car he was interested in buying. No one heard from him in a few days, and his family then contacted Waterbury police. Smolinski left behind his vehicle, wallet and keys, according to police, and hasn't been heard from since.</p> <p>Waterbury police Lt. Chris Corbett said the FBI is the lead investigating agency on the case. According to Corbett, searchers did not find anything Monday.</p> <p>Shelton police Capt. Michael Madden said that authorities from the other agencies "were in Shelton following up on leads."</p> <p>Investigators focused on properties in the vicinity of Edgewood Avenue, Fort Hill Avenue and near a Route 8 bridge, according to police.</p> <p>Lt. J. Paul Vance, a spokesman for the state Department of Public Safety, said state police detectives and canines</p>	<p>Advertisement</p>

participated in the search.

FBI spokeswoman Marybeth Miklos confirmed the bureau participated in a search Monday in Shelton, but she declined to comment further.

"The investigation is still ongoing," she said.

Smolinski, who goes by the nicknames of "Bill" and "Billy," was described as 6 feet tall and 200 pounds, with brown hair and blue eyes. He was 31 years old at the time of his disappearance.

He had worked as an apprentice heating and air-conditioning technician and as a part-time tow truck driver, according to the FBI.
